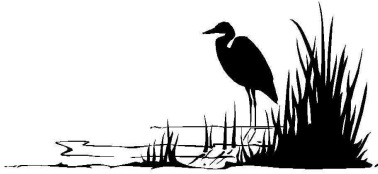


Old Vineries Bridge – Woodcock Lane

Many of you will know and use our historic canal footbridge that joins Woodcock Lane and Woodcock Lane North. Dating back to 1794 the Neighbourhood Forum was very pleased that its application for historical listing to **English Heritage** was successful earlier this year. British Waterways has confirmed that restoration and improvement work to the now Grade II listed bridge and nearby towpath will be starting by the end of November. To celebrate this piece of our heritage (and a very useful walkway) the Forum has produced a postcard of the bridge which is available in local shops and cafes. The Grand Union Canal is a great asset to our area offering tranquility, a haven for wildlife and a connection with our industrial history.

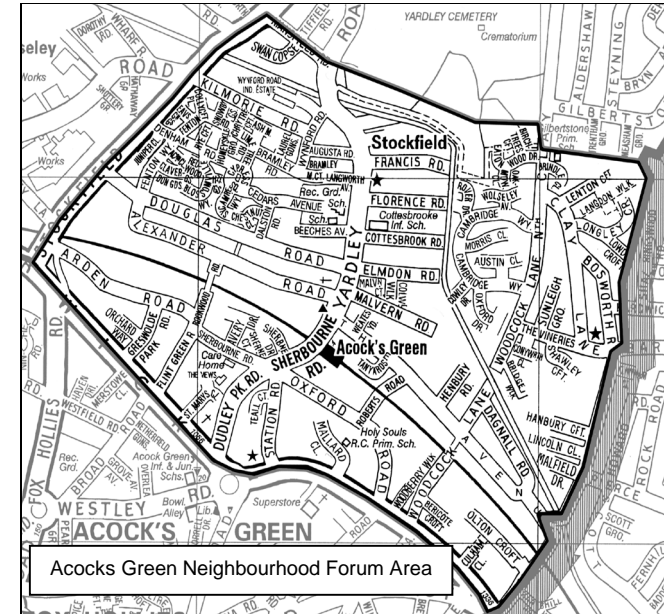

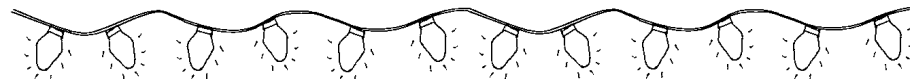
Also there is free internet at all Birmingham Public Libraries. Call in to find out more about what libraries can offer.
