

A Warm Welcome to Village Shoppers & Better Access All Round

New signs to welcome people to our Village are currently being installed. The signs, which will be placed at four 'gateways' to the Village, have been a popular request from local people and traders to give our local shopping centre a stronger sense of identity and to promote our welcoming spirit.



Visitors to the Village cannot have failed to notice a lot of road works going on recently. Two projects, again requested by local people and traders, are taking place. The Warwick Road bus lane has been removed and replaced with two lanes for all road users and a pull in space for buses. Local people and traders voted almost unanimously for this work to take place during the consultation last year. Further into the Village, the bus stop outside Greggs on the single carriageway is being moved to the dual carriageway outside Wetherspoons. This will make it much easier for pedestrians in this busy stretch of the Village and enable other road users to pass stationary buses.

New Bus Services in Acocks Green

From January changes to bus services in the area have resulted in the withdrawal of the 41 and changes to the existing 31 bus service. Also we have three new bus services travelling through Acocks Green :

42 – AG to Solihull via Yardley

3A – AG to City Centre, via Yardley Wood

40 - AG to Baldwins Lane, Hall Green



The **37 bus** to the City Centre is now offering a special '£2.50 return' price or £8.50 for the week. Buy these special offer tickets from the driver. The new timetables are available at the library and we will have a small supply at our Public Meeting.

History of the Canals - new display unveiled

British Waterways and Birmingham City Council have been working together for over a year to improve and promote the canal area of Acocks Green. Thanks to campaigning by the Neighbourhood Forum, funding generated by development of new housing on Woodcock Lane North has been spent on improvement work to the Vineries Bridge, replacing capping stones and posts, resurfacing of the towpath and improvements to the access to Wood Meadow from the canal. The team was also keen to highlight the history of the canals and the importance of their role in Birmingham's industrial heritage.

Acocks Green Library is well known for its collection of resources on railways and so was happy to host a display about the historical role of canals in Acocks Green, continuing the transport theme. By the time this newsletter goes to print the new display should be in place at Acocks Green library. The Neighbourhood Forum has played a role in shaping this project, the Council and British Waterways were always keen to hear the views of locals and tap into their knowledge of the area. Why not visit the library soon to check out the new display.
